Text: Elementary Linear Algebra (9th ed), by B. Kolman and D. R. Hill, Pearson/Prentice Hall, 2008, ISBN 0–13–229654–3.

Material Covered: The course will cover most sections of chapters 1-7. A schedule of the sections to be covered each week is posted on D2L.

Grading: The grade will be based on weekly homework assignments, quizzes, 3 in-class midterm exams, and a final exam. The grade will be determined as follows:

Homework and Quizzes 20% Midterm 1 18% Midterm 2 18% Midterm 3 18% Final Exam 26%

The cutoffs for the letter grades A, B, C, and D will be 88%, 76%, 64%, and 52% respectively. The dates for the exams are listed in the important dates section. There quiz dates will be announced about a week ahead of time.

Quizzes will be counted the same as a homework assignment. The lowest two scores in the homework/quizzes category will be dropped. Note that a total of 2 scores will be dropped (not 2 quizzes and 2 homeworks).

Attendance and make-up exams: Students who miss class are responsible for all material covered in class. Make-up exams and quizzes will be allowed only with a valid excuse and should be taken within a few days of the scheduled exam date. Please let me know as soon as possible if you have a conflict with one of the exams.

Policies on Homework: There will be weekly homework assignments posted on D2L. Assignments will usually be due Tuesdays and cover the material from the previous week. Homework will be collected at the beginning of class and late homework will not be accepted. If you are going to miss class, you can hand in homework early by putting it under the door to my office. Please make sure your assignments are stapled and have your name on them. Also make sure to write legibly and show your work. You may work with others on homework as long as everyone writes up their own solutions.

Homework will usually consist of both book problems and additional problems. It will be graded out of 20 points. The additional problems will be graded in detail for a total of 15 points. There will be another 5 points for completing the book problems and showing work. The book problems assigned will often be odd numbered problems so that you can check your answers in the back of the book. Solutions to the additional problems will be posted on D2L shortly after they are collected.

Calculator Policy: Calculators will not be allowed on exams or quizzes. They may be used on homework assignments, but try not to become dependent on them.
