Material Covered: The course will cover most sections of chapters 1-7. A schedule of the sections to be covered each week is posted on D2L.

Grading: The grade will be based on weekly homework assignments, 3 in-class midterm exams, and a final exam. The grade will be determined as follows:

Homework 10%
Midterm 1 20%
Midterm 2 20%
Midterm 3 20%
Final Exam 30%

The cutoffs for the letter grades A, B, C, and D will be 88%, 76%, 64%, and 52% respectively.

Attendance and make-up exams: Students who miss class are responsible for all material covered in class. Make-up exams will be allowed only with a valid excuse and should be taken within a few days of the scheduled exam date. The midterm and final exam dates are listed in the important dates section. Please let me know as soon as possible if you have a conflict with one of the exams.

Policies on Homework: There will be weekly homework assignments posted on D2L. Assignments will usually be due on Tuesdays and cover the material from the previous week. Homework will be collected in class but can also be turned in during the office hour immediately following the class period that it is due. There will be about 12 assignments and the lowest 2 homework grades will be dropped. No late homework will be accepted. If you are going to miss class, you can hand in homework early by putting it under the door to my office. Please make sure your assignments are stapled and have your name on them. Also make sure to write legibly and show your work. You may work with others on homework as long as everyone writes up their own solutions.

Calculator Policy: Calculators will not be allowed on exams. They may be used on homework assignments, but try not to become dependent on them.
